HySecurity's first employee blood drive was held Tuesday, December 23, 2008 at HySecurity's manufacturing facility in Kent, WA. The Puget Sound Blood Center sent a fully equipped blood donation bus to HySecurity where 20 pints of blood were donated during the 3 hour event.

"The snow storms and icy roads have caused a blood bank shortage in the Seattle area this Winter," said Jim Pyle, HySecurity's Parts Coordinator and organizer of the blood drive. "HySecurity's blood drive couldn't have happened at a better time."
